


LUGGAGE SIZE




Size limits

Make sure your bags meet our size limits before you get to the airport.




Carry-on bags

Your Carry-on bag must fit in the overhead bin, so it must be 9 in x 14 in x 22 in (23 cm x 35 cm x 56 cm). When measuring your bag, be sure to include the handle and wheels.



Personal items

These items must fit under the seat in front of you, so they must be 9 in x 10 in x 17 in (22 cm x 25 cm x 43 cm). Common things include purses, backpacks and laptop bags.





PACKING TIPS



Students will be given a luggage tag when you check in with your chaperone at the airport. Please remember to follow all TSA procedures for packing.

Before Packing

□ Liquids, gels and aerosols packed in carry-on must follow the 3-1-1 liquids rule:

- 3.4 ounces or less per container
- 1 quart size, clear, plastic, zip top bag (all liquids must fit in bag)
- 1 bag per passenger
- □ Review the prohibited items list for both carry-on and checked baggage.
- $\hfill\square$ If purchasing a baggage lock, be sure to look for those that are TSA recognized.
- □ Tape a card with your name and contact information on your electronics.

In Standard Screening Lane

- □ Remove the 3-1-1 liquids bag and place it in the bin.
- □ Ensure pockets are empty (keys, tissues, currency, wallets, cell phones, etc.) and remove bulky jewelry (valuable items can be placed in carry-on).
- □ Remove your shoes and place them directly on the X-ray belt.

□ Remove personal electronic devices larger than a cell phone from your carry-on bag and place them into a bin with nothing placed on or under them for X-ray screening. (E.g. laptops, tablets, e-readers and handheld game consoles.)

□ Remember to check the bins and collect all belongings after going through screening.





Instruments, Flags & Costumes

All instruments, flags and costumes will be transported in the equipment truck.

Truck loading will be on Sunday, November 19th at 5:00 pm.

All students must drop off their equipment at 5:00 pm on Sunday.

PLEASE COOPERATE TO ENSURE A SAFE & FUN TRIP FOR EVERYONE!

1. BE AT THE RIGHT PLACE AT THE RIGHT TIME! Know your schedule.

2. Never go anywhere alone! Stay in a group of three or more at all times.

3. Nutrition is important for peak performance. Sweets and large amounts of caffeine should not be consumed the night before the performance. Eat a good breakfast.

4. Be very courteous at all times. You are a class act, so be sure that your behavior reflects this at all times. Good manners are contagious.

5. Dress appropriately. Appearance must be neat at all times when in uniform or while under observation as representatives of the band program and school.

6. Do not leave the hotel or any place we visit without director's permission.

7. NO P.D.A. – Public Display of Affection. To do so would demonstrate a lack of respect and understanding that you are on a school-sanctioned activity.

8. Proper language is to be used AT ALL TIMES.

9. NO music should be played on buses without headphones. Be considerate of others who are trying to sleep.

10. Courtesy in restaurants. Speak quietly and clean up your area when finished.

11. The use or possession of any alcoholic beverage, tobacco, or drugs is absolutely forbidden at all times. Violation will result in dismissal. The presence of such substance will incriminate all in the room.

12. All prescription medications must be in the original container with the dosage specified on the front and a completed medical form.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In the event of an emergency, such as the declaration of a "code red" security status during the event, the following procedures will be followed:

All students will report to the designated emergency meeting location (see below) at the venue they are in, and await instructions from teachers/chaperones.

- Hotel Lobby
- Food Hall Main entrance
- Broadway or Radio City Main entrance

All students shall have cell phones ON, but WILL NOT place calls. Instead, they shall await a call from chaperones with the next set of instructions.

Students and chaperones will proceed back to the hotel and meet in the lobby. No student shall enter his/her own room or a chaperone room until instructed to do so.

Once in the hotel, the following actions will be carried out:

- · Chaperones will keep students in one area.
- Chaperones will begin contacting parents to confirm that students are safe and inform them to await further instructions.
- Band Director will contact school administration for the course of action to be followed. School administration will be contacted at home or cell phone numbers after school hours.

If it is deemed necessary to immediately return home, Band Director will begin arrangements for transportation back to Stoneman Douglas High School. Parents will be contacted and given a detailed plan of arrangements. School administration shall assist in answering parent concerns until students arrive home safely.

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1. Be considerate at all times, especially in the hotel.

- Be particularly careful about loud noises in the mornings and evenings.
- Instruments are NOT to be played in your rooms.
- Please close doors quietly. Door slamming causes disturbances to others.
- Be reasonably quiet in your rooms. Don't speak loudly! TV volume should be kept to a low level.
- WALK in hallways. No running! Be considerate of others when using the elevators.

2. BOYS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN GIRLS' ROOMS AND GIRLS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN BOYS' ROOMS, even if a chaperone is present. Avoid the appearance of any wrongdoing in this area by staying completely away from rooms of the opposite sex. Additionally, students in same gender relationships are also not allowed to be in each other's rooms.

3. Parents, siblings and alumni are not allowed in student rooms.

4. Be sure to be in your room at or before the designated curfew time. After room check, you may NOT leave your room for ANY reason until wake-up time the next morning. THE DOOR IS TO REMAIN SHUT AND LOCKED!

5. Outside phone calls are not allowed from the rooms. Do not take your phone off the hook. We may need to reach you.

6. Ordering room service or any other outside service is prohibited. Parents may not purchase food for their child's room.

7. Be very careful with hotel property, especially in your rooms. If anything is damaged or missing, you will be charged.

- 8. Your room will be inspected for check out by your chaperone. Be ready and be on time!
- Pack your bags.

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- Place all used towels in the bathtub.
- Garbage in garbage cans (you will be given an extra garbage bag by your chaperone if needed).
- Linens on the bed prior to room check. IT IS NOT THE CHAPERONE'S RESPONSIBILITY TO PICK UP YOUR ROOM.



SAFETY TIPS from BRT



•Stay aware of your surroundings.

- •Know and have programmed our group emergency phone numbers.
- •Stay in groups as instructed. In food hall, stay in groups of 3 or more and while in Times Square or
- other sightseeing stay in chaperone groups.
- •Check in with chaperones should anyone need to leave their group for any reason.
- •Travel with minimal cash and valuables, leaving expensive jewelry, clothes, shoes and personal items at home.
- •For items that must be carried during the trip, please consider using cross-body bags carried in front of your body and **not** bags hanging off backs or shoulders.
- •Use the Bob Rogers App to track your location and that of others. Refresh your location status on a regular basis.



Tips on navigating Times Square



- Do not take "free" items from people handing them out (including CDs, candy). Do not engage just keep walking.
- Costume characters They work for tips and can be aggressive. Do not stop to have your photo taken and do not give them your phone to get a "free" photo with them.
- Beware of the performance artists watch from afar if you'd like, but watching close to the action may get your pulled into their show (and they might expect a tip to let you out of the show).
- Remember, all of these people make a living through these side hustles. They are experienced and have seen kids like you thousands of times. They don't want trouble and don't want to hurt you – they only want your money. Be mindful and follow the guidelines above so they pass over you for an easier target.



DAY 1 – Tuesday Departure



The airline is UNITED AIRLINES. There are 2 flights for STUDENTS:

TERMINAL

Terminal 1, Concourse C

- FLIGHT NUMBER 1537 meet time 4:00 AM. Flight departs at 6:30 AM.
 - This includes the yellow, green, blue and pink group.
- FLIGHT NUMBER 1848 meet time 6:00 AM. Flight departs at 8:00 AM.
 - This is the purple group.

EVERYONE MUST ARRIVE TO THE AIRPORT EARLY. WE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO WAIT FOR YOU IF YOU ARE LATE. TSA WILL BE A LONG PROCESS AND WE CANNOT MISS OUR FLIGHT.



AIRPORT DROP OFF INFORMATION



Ft Lauderdale airport drop off info for United Airlines Terminal 1... Door #123:

This is the 3rd entrance door to enter Terminal 1 from departure drop off area.

Students will go in through door number 123 and you will see the United desk in front of you. Turn left to find your chaperone.

If your parents are parking to walk you in, they should park in the \$3 hourly parking in the Hibiscus Garage 2nd level and go across on the bridge to terminal 1. Once inside go up the escalator to ticketing. We will be nearby on right side once you come off the escalator.

Find and check in with your chaperone as soon as you arrive.



ID needed for flight



> Everyone 18 years old and older needs a valid Government-issued ID.

- Students 17 years old and under will need their student ID for checked luggage identification.
- Students 17 years old and under will NOT use their driver's license to go through TSA as it will slow the process significantly.

We will move through TSA and the airport together in chaperone groups.

➢Once we are in the plane find your seat and then you may change seats within the group if possible.

- Enjoy a group dinner at Dallas BBQ and explore Times Square at night in chaperone groups.






